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### Hurricane Katrina

A few months before Hurricane Katrina, Louisiana Emergency Managers (EMs) met to discuss a better response to Category 3 hurricanes.

The EMs were well aware that many in Louisiana lacked the money, vehicles, and travel experience to evacuate.

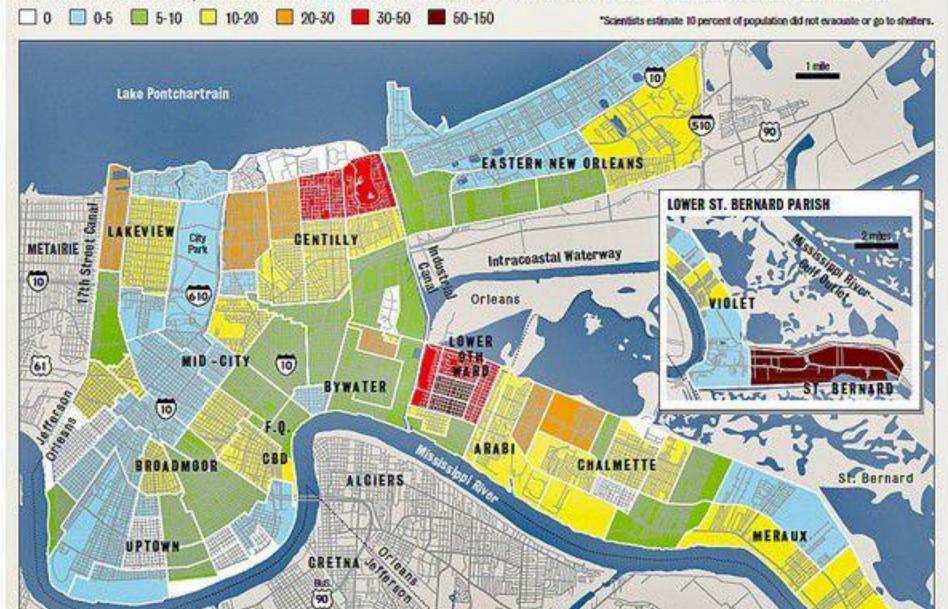
The workshop focused on how to support the evacuation of travel-capable people – those with money, vehicles, and travel expenses.

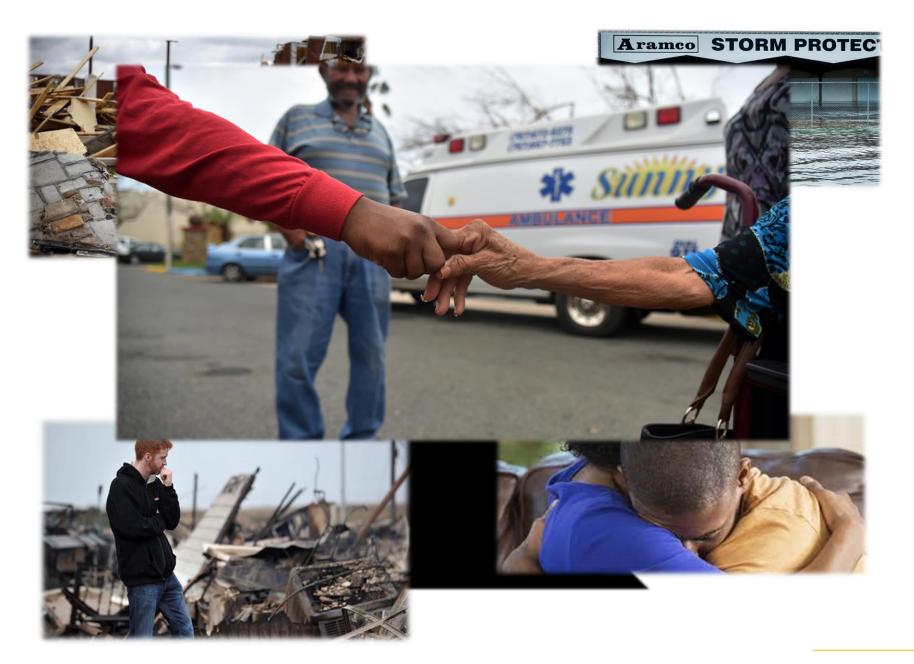
The lack of focus on those without the money, vehicles, or travel experience was explained this way: "past approaches should be adequate."

### DEADLY FLOODING FROM HURRICANE KATRINA'S LEVEE BREACHES

Most Katrina deaths were caused by fast-moving, rising water. The highest numbers of fatalities were found in the Lower 9th Ward near the Industrial Canal floodwall breach and the portion of St. Bernard Parish containing St. Rita's Nursing Home.

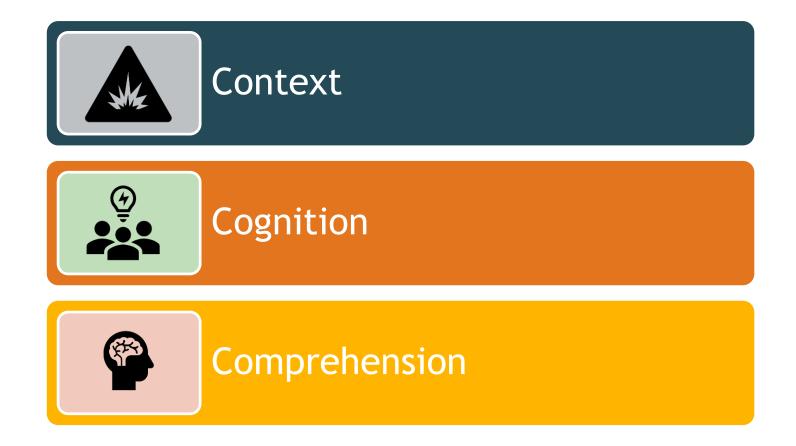

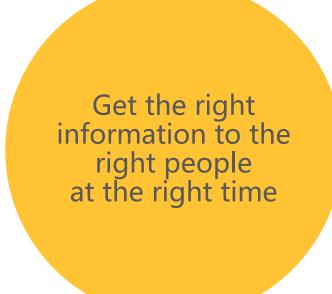


# Context: The environment in which information is taken in

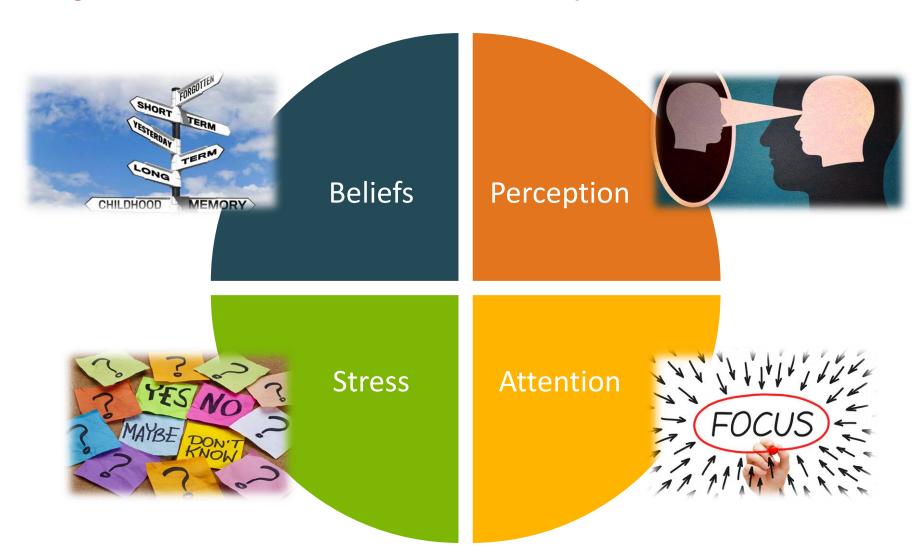


# **Takeaways**

- Identify who you are trying to reach
- Identify barriers in physical environment
- Choose the channel that best meets audience needs at that moment in time
- Make urgent information available at all times – refresh the message often
- Meet the communication needs of the most vulnerable



### Cognition: How users sense and acquire information



# **Takeaways**

- Overcome natural inertia and optimism
- Make proximity of event and potential outcomes clear and focused
- Use credible sources to convey information
- Make warnings short, clear, imperative, and in plain language
- Create specific "calls to action"

Seek to educate and inform as well as change behaviors and attitudes

# Comprehension: How users understand information

To participate in the society, to achieve one's goals, and to develop one's knowledge and potential

- Program for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies
- Surveyed 150,000 adults between the ages of 16-65 in 24 countries
- Measured competency in:
  - Literacy
  - Numeracy
  - Problem solving in technology-rich environments

### PIACC – What adults can do at each level

Use a bus schedule

Level 5

Read price tag

Below Level 1

> Locate single piece of information in familiar texts.

Level 1

Read relatively short digital, print or mixed texts to locate single text. Level 2

Make matches between text and information that may require low level paraphrasing and drawing low-level inferences.

Level 3

Identify, interpret, or evaluate one or more pieces of information and often require varying levels of inference.

Level 4

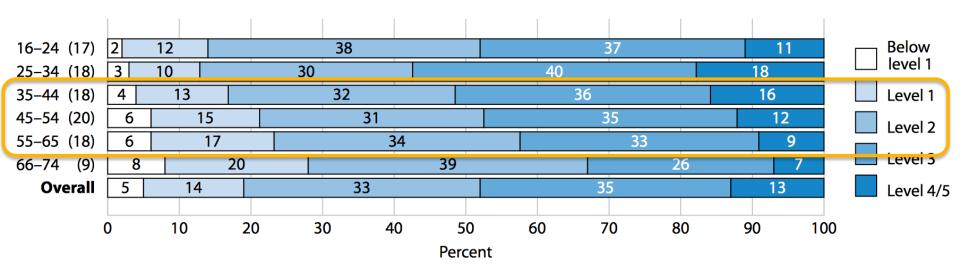
Complete a tax form

> Perform multiplestep operations to integrate, interpret, or synthesize information from complex texts, and may require complex inferences.

Integrate information across multiple, dense texts: construct syntheses, ideas or points of view; or evaluate evidence based arguments.

# **Takeaways**

- Write in a way that a typical person of below average literacy can understand
- Use clear, specific words
- Use active sentences
- Be directive about what people need to do
- Use visuals to reinforce worlds
- Make sure translations are accurate and effective

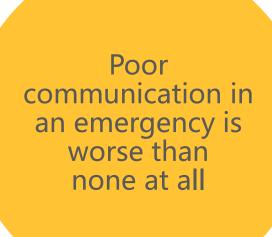

# What Went Wrong?

- Wrong state identified
- Proximity of event and outcome unclear
- Credibility in question
- Additional warning needed to overcome original poor execution
- Affects future belief and attention

### What are Mass Attacks?

#### Assailant(s):

- Use weapons to attack crowds
- Target less protected indoor or outdoor spaces
- Intend to harm multiple victims
- Use the attack(s) to intimidate
- Can use makeshift or modern weapons

#### Types of Mass Attacks

Active shooter: Individuals using firearms to cause mass casualties.

Are these necessary?

- Intentional Vehicular Assault (IVA): Individuals using a vehicle to cause mass casualties.
- Improvised Explosive Device (IED): Individuals using homemade bombs to cause mass casualties.
- Other methods of mass attacks may include knives, fires, drones, or other weapons.

## Summary

- Focus on the people first!
- Address the three C's
  - Context
  - Cognition
  - Comprehension
- Use plain language tools to clarify messages and make them widely accessible
- Test messages
- Plan for emergency communication
